



Observation of World Environmental Day in NEHA'S HOPE Edu care centres (5TH JUNE-2022):

World Environment Day was celebrated on 5th June every year to raise awareness to protect the environment. This day was first celebrated in the year 1973 by the United Nation for raising awareness on various environmental issues.

To nurture and grow the knowledge on Environment children of (Kristalaya Mercy Mission) KMM's Neha's Hope Edu-Care Centre observed and celebrated World Environment Week in its centres. Neha's Hope Educare is the part of KMM's Children Ministry where not only free coaching of school subjects but Sunday schools and other extra curricular activities are also imparted for the holistic development of the child.





This very tender age is the time when the mind is fresh to grasp the love of Lord God and learn Godly values and virtues which the secular schools don't take the responsibility to teach.

Through the celebration our vision is to inculcate among the children the importance of vegetation in human life. All the children and teachers of Neha's Hope took active participation on the occasion. PPT presentation and speeches given by our centre teachers to make the students aware what role should be played by the kids to save the environment. Moreover they came to know that God gave us the authority to overall creations to humans but how humans are misusing it and how we can use God's authority over the creation in a proper way.

Moreover, the kids came to know what responsibility they can engage themselves to save and protect the environment.

Thus, on this very day KMM Edu care kids performed dances; skits based on various environmental themes. There was Art/Drawing competition on the Theme "Environment" for the children according to their age group (Group – A: Nursery to Class – 3, Group – B :Class – 4 to Class– 6 and Group – C: Class – 7 to Class – 10+).





With much enthusiasm the kids had hands-on experience in planting trees. Children were provided with a balanced diet breakfast that included bread, banana, egg, and Bengal gram (legume)-potato curry.

Children will be awarded prizes for the Best Drawing (1st 2nd & 3rd) and consolation to all participants. Almost same types of programs were held in other Neha's Hope Edu-care Centre which is run in by KMM in different districts of West Bengal : Islampur Edu-Care Centre, Manikkundu Edu-Care Centre, Khirpai Edu-Care Centre and Gopalpur Edu-Care Centre.

The kids come mostly from downtrodden families. Mostly the parents are from poor socio-economic background and are solely engaged in earning their livelihood. Therefore Neha's Hope Educare try to inculcate the values through various activities all year round along with Sunday school activities.
